The Facebook group has grown to almost 200 people from across the country! Though it's hard to find time and insight for daily commentaries, this group has encouraged me with their enthusiasm and wisdom. We've now made it through nine months together!

As October starts, the Daily Bible community has finished all of the Hebrew Scriptures, and is turning the page to the New Testament. I'm writing this with the hopes that you will join in this heady adventure for the last three months! From October 1st through to the end of December, we'll read from Matthew to Revelation. (Thankfully, Revelation starts after Christmas, and not before. J) To participate, just click on this link to **Daily Bible** and ask to join the group. This, after all, is why our church (and any church) exists in the first place.


Youth Trip to the Science Museum of MN
