This year's week of classes considered different personality types, how our personalities are best suited for group dynamics, and how we can work best with folks of different personality types. What I found the most interesting and useful from the week was something called the Hermann Brain Dominance Inventory, a description of four different types of personality that each relate to a different color. In the language of this inventory, I'm a Red with shades of Yellow, which is to say that I thrive on relationships, and love to consider the "big picture". Coming back from this week of learnings, I've started reflecting on how this bias toward relationships and big-picture helps (or hinders) my service as your pastor. Similarly, what are the gifts that each of our staff members and leaders brings to their efforts as part of a team? This contemporary tool is another way of saying what the Apostle Paul wrote in his letters, that people serve different roles in the church (much as parts of a body). We need one another, and God has pulled us together to be mutually beneficial community in the service of God's good news.

I am happy to share more as the opportunity arises, and I welcome your questions or comments about these continuing education experiences. Thank you for the gift of time, and the new energy I receive from such learnings. See you in church!

Happy February, everyone! I hope you are all staying warm and surviving our rather bizarre winter. There is a lot going on at EMC and I wanted to catch everyone up as much as possible.

This last Sunday at our Special Congregational Meeting, the congregation approved a proposal submitted by Trustees and Cabinet to pursue an \$800,000 capital campaign over the next few months. The pledges will be payable over a period of 3 years, and will be used to repair and update the church's entryway and gathering space (narthex/library), repair the organ and pay for the exterior repairs that are currently underway on the east wall. We will be hiring the UCC Capital Campaign Services to help us – these are experts who do this work with churches all over the country and who tell us this goal is on the lower side of what we should be able to raise. As we move forward, please visit the church's website, emcucc.org, and sign in as a member or friend to see the initial proposals. These are subject to additional input and discussion, and obviously to final costs. Your thoughts and input on how the space should look and be configured is welcomed - please contact **Thom Miller**, **Charlie Green**, **Jeff** Strickler, Frank Bennett or myself with your input and thoughts! (If you are not yet able to access the membership area of the website, click the button requesting access and you will be sent a password to sign in with.)

There will be a "quiet" period while we form the committee and do some planning and training of committee members, continue to develop plans for the actual repairs and renovations, and develop materials that show the plans more clearly. If you

Pastor Oby, know as soon as possible. Kick off of the actual pledge drive will take place around Easter and last a few weeks.

Speaking of the east wall, this week will see the outdoor work to remove the stone façade move into the building as the contractors prepare to pull the wall back to plumb. There will be supporting columns placed in the preschool room and the library, intended to support the interior building as this happens. These columns are sturdy, but let's encourage the kids not to climb on them, ok? In addition, some of the ceiling in the library will be removed to allow the contractors access to the outer wall. The re-plumbing of the wall may or may not require using the wall in the back of the sanctuary – we are hoping not, but won't know until the contractor is further in the process. This process should take a couple weeks, so be prepared for evidence of construction inside the church for the next couple weeks, and probably beyond as some of the aftermath will need to be repaired (and those repairs will probably be incorporated into the capital campaign projects – no reason to fix it twice).

The Governance Committee is moving forward on a proposed structure for the future governance of the church and is hoping to have it's proposals ready for congregational discussion in the next several weeks. Deacons are planning a great Lenten series, Janet Anderson and BOCE continue to do a great job with both Christian Education and service projects for young and old, and Stewardship is gearing up to start recruiting new members for various committees.

In the late 1940's the members of Edina Morningside Community Church undertook a capital campaign to complete the church building.


