## One Great Hour of Sharing




Through One Great Hour of Sharing, United Church of Christ members reach out in the name of Christ to:

## Altar Flowers



Every week members of the congregation provide the beautiful altar flowers for worship and a dedication is printed in the Sunday Bulletin. The cost of the flowers is \$35 and you are able to take them home. There are many open Sundays through 2017. If you are able to provide worship beauty one Sunday,

The United Church of Christ unites with Christians in eight other Protestant denominations and Church World Service in One Great Hour of Sharing, thus multiplying the effectiveness and extent of our witness many times over.

Administrative costs are typically less than eight percent annually. The UCC annually channels more than \$3 million dollars through One Great Hour of Sharing to humanitarian needs in the world.
