Through the Lens of Faith, by Pastor Oby

What's happening in the world and the church, as it relates to God's purpose for Edina Morningside Church: "Sharing the joy of Christ's love by welcoming and serving".

Rev. Elaine B. Kirkland and I started our ministries at Edina Morningside Church on the same day--Rally Sunday in September of 2016. I'd briefly sung in a choir under Elaine's direction during my college years, and was eager for the opportunity to work again alongside her joyful, creative spirit. What was originally a four-month interim shift as EMC's Music Director has



become the last almost three years of Elaine's leadership as our Minister for Music and Liturgical Arts. Under Elaine's care, the Chancel Choir and Morningside Bells have grown in spirit and numbers, we've begun using a much wider variety of musical forms in worship, and liturgical creativity has blossomed. If you have marveled at awe-inspiring moments on Easter Sunday, been inspired by dramatic interplay between music and worship words, or appreciated creative re-enactments of biblical texts on Sunday mornings, that is in large part due to Elaine's talents and those of the teams she has gathered around for such work. In every part of our ministries that she has touched, in my regular planning meetings with her, and in collaborations with other staff and church members, Elaine has watered the seeds of inspiration in others, coached flexibility in the face of change, led with an eye toward justice and love, modeled joy in the journey of life, and committed to the hard work of seeing a vision become reality. What I treasure most in Elaine's leadership is her patient ability to nurture courage, again and again nudging hesitant people like me to the edge of our comfort zones to "do a new thing" with God and this community. Because of Elaine's confidence and detailed preparation, we succeed beyond our earlier imaginings.

Elaine's years at Edina Morningside Church were an unexpected "encore" after she had already retired from a full and successful career as a UCC pastor and music minister, most recently at Mt. Sinai Congregational Church, UCC in Mt. Sinai, New York. She and Lisa Lally have postponed since 2016 the delights of retirement and travel, for which they originally moved to Minnesota. Now as Elaine takes her leave from a staff role at Edina Morningside Church, they will at last have more time for travel and rest. Because they remain members at EMC (and Lisa has just begun at least a year of service as our Moderator), Elaine will not vanish from the community. She will, though, take some months for renewal and worship elsewhere, giving the professional courtesy of time and space for our next Music Director (Conie Borchardt) to establish herself in the role. We'll miss Elaine's weekly presence, but look forward to future occasions when we shall be together again.

Please join the entire church and I this Sunday morning at 10am for a final worship service with Elaine's leadership, and then a reception downstairs afterwards in her honor. Thank you, Elaine--your faith and leadership have given us the skills and courage to navigate well going forward, even in changing times like these!

June Worship and Second Hour Preview

June 2nd: Finishing the Easter season and preparing for Pentecost, we share in a service of music and **farewell for Rev. Elaine B. Kirkland**, as she steps back from her role as our Director of Music and Liturgical Arts. Elaine reflects on how God is "doing a new thing" (Isaiah 43:18-20), we share communion with her by intinction at the front of the sanctuary, and receive a choral benediction at the end. Second Hour is a reception for Elaine in Fellowship Hall.

June 9th: On Pentecost Sunday we celebrate "the birthday of the church", when the Holy Spirit caused a great movement of wind, fire and speaking in tongues, sparking the movement of Christ's disciples to go and share "good news". We also welcome EMC's incoming Music Director Conie Borchardt, and celebrate this year's graduates from high school and college. If you can, wear red—a color of the Holy Spirit!

June 16th: We mark Pride Sunday one week before Twin Cities Pride, and two weeks before World Pride in New York City commemorates fifty years (to the day) since the Stonewall uprising started the modern movement for LGBTQ equality. Guest Michael Dhani Bennett brings special music with voice and brass, while the Second Hour afterward is a conversation about LGBT equality with Jesus Lucero from OutFront Minnesota. Wear rainbows!

June 23rd: Worship starts with youth from Morningside Theatre Company singing from the musical they've been rehearsing all month, the title song from "Legally Blonde: The Musical". We also continue in the second week of a **worship series on Sabbath**.

June 30th: This service concludes our series focused on Sabbath, and the Second Hour is a report on **discoveries in the Church Archives**. A state grant has helped us contract with a specialist to catalogue our 3-D objects in the church, so we'll have a show-and-tell about

what has been found recently.

Note that worship in July moves to Wednesdays instead of Sundays, beginning with Wednesday, July 3rd.

From the Archives....

During the month of May, Phase 1 of the church archives project started work on cataloging and labeling all of the historic furniture and furnishings in the church, eg; lecterns, pulpit, pews, reredos including the dossal curtains, hanging chandeliers and stained glass windows in the Sanctuary, including a professionally-taken photo of the rose window above the Chancel. In the weeks to come, an enlarged photo will be displayed of this wonderful window we couldn't quite see clearly viewing it from the floor.

Each object now cataloged has been given a unique locator number entered into the archives collection management system (CMS), including condition reports, complete descriptions of each

item of furniture and furnishings, along with historical background notes and photographs. Where the back story of the object is known, that is included as well.

This task is complete and now we are on to working with the books and bibles in the church collection, which we hope will be finished during the month of June. We then anticipate a final brief catalogue and labeling effort for historic furnishings discovered and not entered during our work in May, and then a final project report submitted as required by our grant funding agency, the MN Historical Society (MNHS).

Once the report is accepted and considered closed, another grant funding request will be written and submitted in September 2019. This is intended to cover Phase 2 of the church archives project: to continue cataloging/labeling work consisting of 2" x 2" slides, lantern slides, early to midcentury photographs, and other audio/visual media in the collection.

If we are successful and are again awarded additional MN Legacy Grant funding by MNHS, Phase 2 of the project will begin this Fall the first week in October.

On June 30th at Second Hour, the entire Archives team will host a review on efforts to date that have been taken to safeguard the church collection. Be sure to take a moment to stop by and meet those involved in this effort. The Archives remains open and available if you'd ever like to stop in and look around during cataloging work.
